



Apples & Pears

Bananas & Plantains

All banana SKUs and 50lb plantains are currently in short supply. A recent surge in demand, coupled with ongoing vessel delays, has contributed to a tighter situation compared to last week. There is no additional fruit available at this time, and we are doing our utmost to serve our customers.

Mangoes

Supply is currently stable. However, some Mexican Atkin Tommy Mangoes are raising quality concerns in the market. Early next week, we will introduce SUGAR BABY MANGO 2KG, which promises the best quality and price available. Additionally, we continue to provide RIPE PERU KENT 5.5KG. Melons

Cantaloupe & Honeydew: At present, these fruits are primarily imported from abroad. Arizona's season is set to commence next month, followed by California's. Meanwhile, Mexican produce is starting to arrive, featuring limited quantities of cantaloupe and a good supply of honeydew.



Grapes

Green Grapes - The market is up due to high-quality Chilean fruit. Prices will stay high next week. Mexico starts mid-May with Early Sweets. Next week: Sweet Globes (Peru) and Thompsons (Chile).

Black Grapes - Sweet Flavours and Black Sables from Chile available next week. Good quality and steady supply expected.

Red Grapes - Slight increase in prices. Mexico starts with Allisons end of May/early June. Next week: Sweet Celebrations, Allisons, and Red Globes (Chile).

Strawberries

Florida and most of Mexico is now finished, with a lot of fruit coming out of California.

Delayed growing in the early regions has cause it to hit full production as newer regions start. They will be a good promo item until late may!

Watermelon

Mexico is currently facing limited supply, but this is anticipated to improve next week with the addition of new regions. Although prices are high at the moment, they may decrease soon. Arizona's supply is set to start in a month, while Mexico continues to be a significant source for the time being.

Cucumbers

Prices are on the decline, which is a favourable trend. Meanwhile, supply remains consistent, exhibiting no notable fluctuations.

Clementines Easy Peelers

We have weekly shipments of Israeli Orris, and Moroccan Nadorcotts. US fruit is high-quality and competitively priced, available in bulk and 2lb bags. Israeli Orris are very sweet, while Moroccan Nadorcotts are decreasing in supply due to high demand. Please coordinate with your sales representative for orders.

Grapefruit

We are due to receive a load of California fruit in on the weekend in sizes 32/48/56.

Stone Fruit

Now carrying 10x2lb and 9kg bulk Nectarines, Peaches, and Plums from Chile. California starts mid to late May, Plums two weeks later. Good crop expected.

Blueberries

We have moved our supply chain operations to Florida, while still sourcing some products from Mexico. Due to increasing costs, we will prioritize 6oz packs as our preferred choice until May, considering the impact of cold weather conditions.

Pomegranates

New arrivals from Peru (sizes 5–12). The "Wonderful" variety is known for sweet taste and red color. Next arrival: April 11.

Green Beans

The market is extremely tight on both sides Mexico and the US In the US, it's due to turf issues and a production gap. In Mexico, they have water issues and are not producing much. Prices are high, and quality is fair.

Oranges

The prices of Navels are increasing, which is typical for this time of year. Egyptian Valencias have arrived

Lemons & Limes

The market has finally picked up, and prices have firmed up. Offshore fruit is having a slow start due to weather, while the Lome market is steady out of Mexico. We are now getting into some Honduras fruit.

Blackberries

The availability of Mexican products is starting to decrease. Blackberries are currently in short supply and quite firm, leading to restricted access. Worries about volume will continue until supplies of US products arrive.

Raspberries

The demand for Mexican products is starting to wane. Until US products gain dominance, volume will remain a significant concern.

Zucchini

As the warmer months approach, the market is beginning to slow down. Prices are decreasing while maintaining high quality, creating a fantastic opportunity to promote this product.



Hot House Peppers

Peppers

Pepper prices are rising due to supply gaps in Mexico and the end of the season in Florida. With upcoming holidays, the market is expected to remain high.

Cauliflower

The US market continues to show stability, and we expect that new T&A 9s and 12s will be ready and available this weekend.

Broccoli

Market conditions remain steady. We are currently sourcing Andy Boy Broccoli from Salinas, and shortcut crowns are also available.

Asparagus

Local season has begun, and the quality is excellent. The available sizes are 28lb and 11lh

Celery

The US Celery market continues to be stable. Snoboy will be available next week.

Eggplant

Mexico and Florida face a supply issue as Mexico's season ends and prices rise. Once Georgia starts its season in about 14 days, they will switch to Georgia eggplant, currently creating a supply gap.

Lettuce

The market is steady. New arrivals of Andy Boy, Snoboy and T&A Lettuce is expected this weekend.

Squash (Butternut, Spaghetti, and Acorn)

The season in Mexico is delayed due to cold weather, causing tight supply and high prices. However, more volume is expected in 10 to 14 days, with increased production of medium and large sizes, leading to more affordable pricing. It's an opportune time to promote.

Napa Cabbage

The US east coast market season is about to start. More supply will be available in the next few weeks. Pricing will become more stable. For more details, please contact your Sales Representative.

Mixed Greens

We're beginning to transition some items to New Jersey and we'll have product from both Texas and New Jersey (Little Bear) available next week.

Salads

The prices of most salads have remained stable, except for shredded cabbage, which has experienced some fluctuations. All salad supplies are being sourced from California after a complete transition.

Corn
